Sacraments

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM - Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday at 12:15pm. Parents are expected to attend a Pre-Jordan Baptism class. Please call the Rectory to register for a class so that we have adequate materials. Godparents and children are welcome to attend.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE - In order to accommodate our own Parishioners, only Parishioners of St. Peter (Bride or Groom) will be able to be married in St. Peter Church. Couples planning to marry at St. Peter are expected to contact the priest to arrange a date and time first. Second, they must attend the Pre-Cana Conferences as mandated by the Bishop. The period of preparation for marriage is a minimum of six months to ensure completion of all arrangements before the wedding date. For Pre-Cana reservations call 663-1373. Only Parish Musicians are permitted for Wedding Masses. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - The priests may be called at any time day or night for the Sacrament of the Sick. Furthermore, the priests will be happy to visit the Sick with Holy Communion upon request.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - (Confessions) Saturday from 4:00-4:55pm and 7:30-8:00 pm or contact one of the priests.

FUNERALS - The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. Viewings in the Church are not permitted. Funeral Masses are scheduled at 10:00am. No eulogies in church, and only Parish Musicians are permitted for Funeral Masses, **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Catholics and Cremation



Once again I would like to remind you of the Catholic teaching on cremation. This is important because many today are disposing of or preserving the cremains of their loved ones in ways that are not proper. Find below our Church's instructions on this matter.

What Is The Church's Teaching?

The Church earnestly recommends the pious custom of burying the bodies of the dead be observed. Cremated remains are the body of the deceased in a changed form. We should honor them as we honor the body. They must be reverently buried or entombed in a place reserved for the burial of the dead. It is never too late to entomb your loved one's cremated remains.

What Is The Accepted Practice?

Cremated remains must be placed in an appropriate container. This container need not be an expensive urn. The plastic or cardboard container into which the crematorium places the cremated remains is sufficient for burial or placement in a niche in a cemetery. Contemporary cultural practices like scattering the cremated remains, keeping them at home, or placing them in memorabilia like jewelry or paper weights are **NOT** considered reverent forms of disposition which the Church requires.

A Catholic burial consists of three parts

The **Vigil Service** focuses on the life of the newly departed loved one. The Vigil Service is usually held the eve before the funeral Mass and burial rite. However, more recently many Catholics have chosen to combine it and hold the vigil the same day of the funeral and burial, holding it a few hours prior to the funeral Mass. Your funeral director can help you decide what is best for you and your family.

The **Funeral Liturgy** is the central liturgical celebration and thus is centered upon Jesus' life, death and resurrection. It focuses on the presentation of the deceased to the Lord. The Funeral Mass includes the procession with the body, renewal of baptism, liturgy of the word, liturgy of the eucharist and concludes with a blessing and farewell song.

Many symbols are used including anointing the body with baptismal water, burning incense, placing the white funeral pall on the casket, placing the cross and bible on the casket. All are signs of preparation for the body to be presented to the Lord. The departed loved one and family members process up the aisle presenting the body of their loved one to the Lord. Although their loved one is gone from this earthly life, the Mass is beautiful and it provides promise for eternal life while moving to a new spiritual relationship with God.

The **Rite of Committal** is the final farewell and takes place at a Catholic cemetery or mausoleum. From the funeral Mass the remains are taken to its final resting place. Here the family members and friends gather to say their final farewell and place the body in its eternal resting place awaiting resurrection through Jesus Christ. The burial can consist of blessing of the gravesite, scripture, intercessions, prayers of committal and end with a song of farewell. A priest or deacon resides over the burial location and leads all in attendance. For in-ground burials, typically everyone places a flower on the coffin and says good-bye. This is the climax of a Catholic funeral.

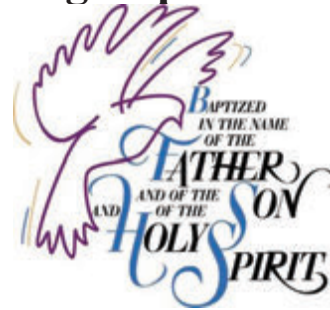


First Collection for the weekend of June 29 – June 30 was **\$13,821.56**. Second Collection was **\$2,544.22** for a total of **\$16,365.78**.

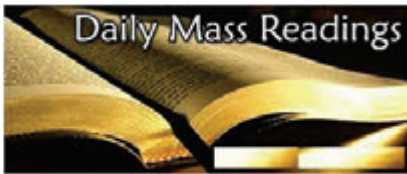

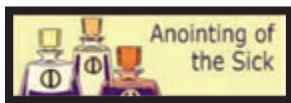

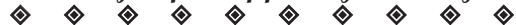

New Jersey Independent Victims Compensation Program

The Diocese of Camden – along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey – has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those, who as children or young adults, were sexually abused by a priest of the Diocese.

The IVCP is independently administered by experienced victim compensation experts Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and operates independently of the Diocese or any church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of the compensation for those who make a claim will be independently determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims – no matter when the abuse occurred – are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially.

Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to www.njdiocesesivcp.com and reviewing the protocol for submitting a claim.

Bishop Sullivan strongly encourages anyone who was sexually victimized by a priest of the Diocese to participate in the IVCP, and has asked that anyone who knows of someone who was abused to contact them so that they are aware of the IVCP and can participate in it.

Readings for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

July 14, 2019

Reading I – Deuteronomy 30:10-14

Moses said to the people:

"If only you would heed the voice of the LORD, your God, and keep his commandments and statutes that are written in this book of the law, when you return to the LORD, your God, with all your heart and all your soul.

"For this command that I enjoin on you today is not too mysterious and remote for you. It is not up in the sky, that you should say, 'Who will go up in the sky to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' Nor is it across the sea, that you should say, 'Who will cross the sea to get it for us and tell us of it, that we may carry it out?' No, it is something very near to you, already in your mouths and in your hearts; you have only to carry it out."

Responsorial Psalm – Psalm 69:14, 17, 30-31, 33-34, 36, 37

***R.* Turn to the Lord in your need, and you will live.**

I pray to you, O LORD, for the time of your favor, O God! In your great kindness answer me with your constant help. Answer me, O LORD, for bounteous is your kindness: in your great mercy turn toward me.

Reading II - Colossians 1:15-20

Christ Jesus is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For in him were created all things in heaven and on earth, the visible and the invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers; all things were created through him and for him. He is before all things, and in him all things hold together. He is the head of the body, the church. He is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things he himself might be preeminent. For in him all the fullness was pleased to dwell, and through him to reconcile all things for him, making peace by the blood of his cross through him, whether those on earth or those in heaven.

Gospel – Luke 10:25-37

There was a scholar of the law who stood up to test him and said, "Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus said to him, "What is written in the law? How do you read it?" He said in reply, *You shall love the Lord, your God, with all your heart, with all your being, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbor as yourself.*" He replied to him, "You have answered correctly; do this and you will live."

But because he wished to justify himself, he said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbor?" Jesus replied, "A man fell victim to robbers as he went down from Jerusalem to Jericho. They stripped and beat him and went off leaving him half-dead. A priest happened to be going down that road, but when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. Likewise a Levite came to the place, and when he saw him, he passed by on the opposite side. But a Samaritan traveler who came upon him was moved with compassion at the sight. He approached the victim, poured oil and wine over his wounds and bandaged them. Then he lifted him up on his own animal, took him to an inn, and cared for him. The next day he took out two silver coins and gave them to the innkeeper with the instruction, 'Take care of him. If you spend more than what I have given you, I shall repay you on my way back.' Which of these three, in your opinion, was neighbor to the robbers' victim?" He answered, "The one who treated him with mercy." Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."
