Sacraments

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM - Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday at 12:15pm. Parents are expected to attend a Pre-Jordan Baptism class. Please call the Rectory to register for a class so that we have adequate materials. Godparents and children are welcome to attend.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE - In order to accommodate our own Parishioners, only Parishioners of St. Peter (Bride or Groom) will be able to be married in St. Peter Church. Couples planning to marry at St. Peter are expected to contact the priest to arrange a date and time first. Second, they must attend the Pre-Cana Conferences as mandated by the Bishop. The period of preparation for marriage is a minimum of six months to ensure completion of all arrangements before the wedding date. For Pre-Cana reservations call 663-1373. Only Parish Musicians are permitted for Wedding Masses. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - The priests may be called at any time day or night for the Sacrament of the Sick. Furthermore, the priests will be happy to visit the Sick with Holy Communion upon request.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - (Confessions) Saturday from 4:00-4:55pm and 7:00-7:30 pm or contact one of the priests.

FUNERALS - The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. Viewings in the Church are not permitted. Funeral Masses are scheduled at 10:00am. No eulogies in church, and only Parish Musicians are permitted for Funeral Masses, **NO EXCEPTIONS.**



COVID Status Report

St. Peter Church ~ September 20, 2020



It has been six months now since the “Coronavirus Cloud” has covered the earth. I would like to give you a status report of the parish life here at St. Peter’s at this point in time.

Now that Labor Day is behind us and there seems to be a gradual loosening of restrictions, we will be monitoring our weekend Mass attendance carefully. Should there be an increase in attendance, warranting a third Sunday morning Mass, we will add one. I will keep you posted on this matter!

Regarding the Sunday Evening Mass, the 6:45 am weekday Mass and exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament, there are no immediate plans to reinstitute them, although this is ultimately our goal. Likewise, there are no plans to resume bingo, indoor sports, formal Youth Group meetings, social events, etc., in the near future.

The rationale for deferring these and other standard pre-COVID parish activities is as follows. We are in Phase One of the COVID response with no evidence that we are about to enter the next phase. In the latest diocesan update of Phase One (September 11, 2020), the restrictions on indoor gatherings include a 25% maximum, (30% in church) six-foot distancing, masks, hand sanitizing, the sanitizing of all surfaces of contact, and a prohibition on all communal food and beverage services. Altar servers are still on hold. The sanitizing of surfaces requires a competent team of volunteers to be readily available to accomplish this after every event. All of these requirements make parish gatherings other than Mass impractical for now.

You may have noticed that many people have yet to return to work. The roads are sparsely occupied during the former morning and evening rush hours. Also, there is very little traffic after 7:00 pm. When darkness sets in as we approach the fall and winter, this will become more pronounced as people stay safely at home in the evenings. Thus, evening Masses and meetings will not be opportune. One exception to this will be our Forty Hours devotions on October 4, 5 and 6.

A few have inquired about regular exposition of the Blessed Sacrament in church during the day. Except for immediately after the weekday Mass, when I stop over to church at various times, I see one, two, maybe three people praying; often none. It is usually the same people. This has been the case for the past four months. The Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord Jesus Christ is truly and really present in the tabernacle. Few people have come to visit Him. This clearly indicates that there is no reason to risk exposing the Blessed Sacrament at this point in time.

The greatest factor for not resuming many of our activities is that certain experts are predicting a second wave of COVID-19 this fall and winter. It is simply not advisable to re-start our activities with this possibility looming. To re-start and shutdown our programs would be imprudent and most disheartening. Similarly, parish planning for the immediate future is not possible until we see if the second wave materializes.

Regarding parish finances, as many people are out of work or watch Mass at home our collection is off. Our parish employees are a long way from their pre-COVID hours and wage levels, including myself. Because we have striven to be very cost-conscious, and because many parishioners have graciously come forward with their time, talent and treasure, we are holding our own. But, please continue to be as generous as possible to your parish.





Gospel – Matthew 20:1-16a

Jesus told his disciples this parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a landowner who went out at dawn to hire laborers for his vineyard. After agreeing with them for the usual daily wage, he sent them into his vineyard. Going out about nine o'clock, the landowner saw others standing idle in the marketplace, and he said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard, and I will give you what is just.' So they went off. And he went out again around noon, and around three o'clock, and did likewise. Going out about five o'clock, the landowner found others standing around, and said to them, 'Why do you stand here idle all day?' They answered, 'Because no one has hired us.' He said to them, 'You too go into my vineyard.' When it was evening the owner of the vineyard said to his foreman, 'Summon the laborers and give them their pay, beginning with the last and ending with the first.' When those who had started about five o'clock came, each received the usual daily wage. So when the first came, they thought that they would receive more, but each of them also got the usual wage. And on receiving it they grumbled against the landowner, saying, 'These last ones worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us, who bore the day's burden and the heat.' He said to one of them in reply, 'My friend, I am not cheating you. Did you not agree with me for the usual daily wage? Take what is yours and go. What if I wish to give this last one the same as you? Or am I not free to do as I wish with my own money? Are you envious because I am generous?' Thus, the last will be first, and the first will be last."
