SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM - Baptisms are celebrated every Sunday at 12:15pm. Parents are expected to attend a Pre-Jordan Baptism class. Please call the Rectory to register for a class so that we have adequate materials. Godparents and children are welcome to attend.

SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE - In order to accommodate our own Parishioners, only Parishioners of St. Peter (Bride or Groom) will be able to be married in St. Peter Church. Couples planning to marry at St. Peter are expected to contact the priest to arrange a date and time first. Second, they must attend the Pre-Cana Conferences as mandated by the Bishop. The period of preparation for marriage is a minimum of six months to ensure completion of all arrangements before the wedding date. For Pre-Cana reservations call 663-1373. Only Parish Musicians are permitted for Wedding Masses. **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

SACRAMENT OF THE SICK - The priests may be called at any time day or night for the Sacrament of the Sick. Furthermore, the priests will be happy to visit the Sick with Holy Communion upon request.

SACRAMENT OF RECONCILIATION - (Confessions) Saturday from 4:00-4:55pm and 7:00-7:30 pm or contact one of the priests.

FUNERALS - The proper form of Church burial for a baptized Catholic is the Mass of Christian Burial, not a service at a funeral home. Viewings in the Church are not permitted. Funeral Masses are scheduled at 10:00am. No eulogies in church, and only Parish Musicians are permitted for Funeral Masses, **NO EXCEPTIONS.**

Racism and Life



As of late, Planned Parenthood is attempting to publicly distance itself from its founder, Margaret Sanger. She was a committed abortionist, eugenicist and heroine of the feminist movement. Although Planned Parenthood has no choice but to denounce Sanger as a racist, they continue to carry out her white supremacist agenda.

Almost 80% of the [Planned Parenthood] corporation's surgical abortion facilities are, and will likely remain located in minority neighborhoods. Small wonder that African American women's abortion rate is three times higher than Caucasian women's; and that, in New York City, far more Black babies are aborted annually than are born alive. Minority abortion is Planned Parenthood's bread and butter, and the organization will continue to aggressively market, facilitate and perform those abortions in vulnerable communities of color.

For decades, Planned Parenthood has been hailing its founder as a "trail-blazer", knowing full well of her goal to eliminate certain "undesirable" elements of society. In a 1921 speech, Sanger

distinguished between the "intelligent and wealthy," who, she said, responsibly limit the size of their families, and the poor, who she said, must be stopped from reproducing because their children will taint the American race: "We desire to stop at its source the disease, poverty, feeble-mindedness and insanity which exist today, for these lower the standards of

civilization and make for race deterioration". She took specific aim at African Americans in 1939, when introducing the Negro Project, expressly designed to restrict their population.

Planned Parenthood continues to advance this mission today.

It doesn't seek to reduce misery but to eliminate the miserable through abortion. This is why Planned Parenthood lobbies relentlessly for Medicaid funding for abortions for low-income women. Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg admitted just this in a New York Times interview, in which she said that "at the time *Roe* was decided, there was concern about population growth and particularly growth in populations that we don't want to have too many of."

Those "populations" refer to the ethnic groups that Sanger sought to reduce and eliminate: minorities. At one time, this outrageous agenda was strongly denounced by all upstanding Americans.

Civil-rights leaders once condemned this mentality. "The Constitution called us three-fifths human, and then whites further dehumanized us . . . Those advocates of taking life prior to birth do not call it "killing" or "murder"; they call it "abortion". They further never talk about aborting a baby, because that would imply something human. Rather, they talk about aborting the fetus. "Fetus" sounds less than human . . ." That's Jesse Jackson, speaking to the National Right to Life Committee in 1977.

As we call for social reform and resist every manifestation of racism in our land, perhaps a new chant will begin to resound in our streets: **"Black babies matter; all babies matter"**.

Dear Parishioners,

This year has seen historic difficulties in South Jersey, in our country and across the world due to the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic to which our diocese has not been immune. These pandemic ripples have taken many forms, among which has been its effect on the finances of our diocese.

These effects, which have curtailed our revenue and deeply impacted our parishioners and neighbors, were further compounded by the over \$8 million we have paid out this year through the New Jersey Independent Victims Compensation Program to victims of clergy abuse, money which we have had to borrow. Additionally, the recent repeal of the statute of limitations has resulted in over fifty lawsuits being filed against the diocese involving long-ago claims of abuse. If it were just the pandemic, or just the costs of the Victims Compensation Program, we could likely weather the financial impact; however, the combination of these factors has made that impracticable. Because of this, today I announce that the Diocese of Camden is filing for reorganization under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code.

The Chapter 11 reorganization is aimed at the maximum fairness and equity possible to address the remaining abuse claims, streamline substantial legal expenses, and avoid the race to the courthouse which would likely cause later claimants to be left without a remedy.

Well-known public entities and other Catholic dioceses across the country have been forced recently to do likewise.

As always, the pastoral care of the people of the Diocese of Camden remains my primary concern and responsibility. We undertake this reorganization so that the mission of the Catholic Church in South Jersey may continue for generations to come.

A second time he sent other servants, saying, "Tell those invited: "Behold, I have prepared my banquet, my calves and fattened cattle are killed, and everything is ready; come to the feast.'" Some ignored the invitation and went away, one to his farm, another to his business. The rest laid hold of his servants, mistreated them, and killed them. The king was enraged and sent his troops, destroyed those murderers, and burned their city. Then he said to his servants, "The feast is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy to come. Go out, therefore, into the main roads and invite to the feast whomever you find." The servants went out into the streets and gathered all they found, bad and good alike, and the hall was filled with guests.
